Bible Reading: Matthew 6:25-34

If he puts that much thought and attention into how they look how much more will God take care of our clothes. Will he not provide the building space whether it is at our current location or somewhere else? It is in God's hands and hopefully that can at least ease some of our worries.

The real focus of our attention should instead be verse 33. "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." As we continue to seek and discern what it is that God has for us. Pray that God would show us what would be best for his kingdom, and ask that he would help us trust in him for the rest.
