Bible Reading: John 17

Throughout the last 22 days we have prayed for Bethel Church, for Classis Zeeland, for the CRC, the global church and for Restoration Church. Why would we do this, because all of this is bigger than we are. God is a unifying being. He brings us all together. He has unified us to himself through Jesus. We were separated far from him in our sin. And Jesus paid for that sin and brought us back together. He unified us in him. All the work we do as a church isn't ultimately for us. It is for the classis, it isn't for the denomination. It is for God! He is the one who deserves all the glory!

In John 17 Jesus prays for all those who believe in him. And his prayer is that we might find complete unity in him. In verse 21 Jesus explains that the reason he wants unity in the church is, "so that the world may believe that you have sent me." We find the same idea is verse 23, "...so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

When we are united in the church and as believers across churches we give out a testimony of the goodness of God. Our lives then become a testimony of the love of God that we have received and that we put on display. Unity in the church makes Jesus' name known. Unity in the church is a testimony of the character of God.

Today, pray for unity. Pray that we would be united at Bethel. Pray that the global church can find unity. Not for our sake, but because it will give glory to God. Because it will put his love on display to the world.

Bible Reading: Numbers 27:15-23

Moses was an incredible leader for Israel. Sure, he had his faults, and he made his fair share of mistakes. But he was still a good leader. It was called up in one of the most crucial moments of Israel's history. He led the people out of slavery in Egypt and across the Red Sea.

But there comes a time where every leader needs to start passing the torch on to someone else. Moses prays to the Lord in Num. 27:16, "May the Lord, the God who gives breath to all living things, appoint someone over this community." Moses' prayer is for a successor. It is for the next generation to rise up.

Bethel - Young Adults/Children

Bible Reading: Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Psalm 78:1-8

They have been faithful in sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. It is now our turn for the next generation. Ps. 78:6-7 wants the next generation to know the good deeds of the Lord.
